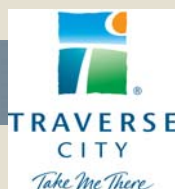

Welcome to Traverse City!

The Michigan Lighthouse Alliance and Traverse City welcome you to the area. We hope you enjoy the conference and are able to visit the area's shops and sites to see what makes Michigan so special. There's plenty to do and see in Traverse City during the summer. In fact, your biggest problem may be finding time to do everything!

Here are a few ways to enjoy some of this area's unique cultural, recreational and scenic features.

- The most stunning features of Traverse City are its sandy shorelines along Grand Traverse Bay and Lake Michigan, and its crystal clear lakes. Make some memories by treasure hunting, beach bumming or building sand castles.
- Associated with the lakes and shorelines are five (5) lighthouses:
 - ◆ Pt. Betsie marks the southern entrance to the Manitou Passage and is a favorite sunset viewing spot.
 - ◆ South Manitou Island Lighthouse is accessed via Manitou Island Transit's passenger ferry out of Leland.
 - ◆ South Fox Island Lighthouse is accessed only by private boat via the Fox Island Lighthouse Association.
 - ◆ Grand Traverse Lighthouse Museum is located at the tip of the Leelanau Peninsula, open daily for tours.
 - ◆ Old Mission Point is at the tip of Old Mission Peninsula and is now open for visitors.
- Museums and organizations, both small and large, are plentiful and share the rich history of the area. The Grand Traverse Heritage Center houses five groups that focus on themes such as Women's History, Rocks & Minerals, Railroads, and Maritime Heritage.
- Walk, bike, skate, or jog along the Traverse Area Recreational Trail (TART), a paved 10-mile trail that takes you from one end of town to the other. Take one of the many hikes, bird watching excursions, canoe or kayak trips available in the area. Golf courses abound.
- Traverse City has a vibrant downtown shopping area with more than 150 shops, boutiques and restaurants. Downtown and Old Town, with their architectural links to the 19th century, lend a historic atmosphere to your shopping experience.
- Visit Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, a 64-mile symphony of water, sky and towering dunes. Enjoy splendid views, indulge in a little beachcombing and try some of the miles of trails that make this area a hiker's paradise.
- Its location on the 45th parallel provides the Traverse Area with the ideal climate for growing grapes. Since 1974 vintners and wineries have produced a variety of quality award-winning reds, Pinot Noirs, ice wines and others. Visitors can enjoy tours and tastings at beautiful wineries located throughout the Old Mission and Leelanau Peninsulas.

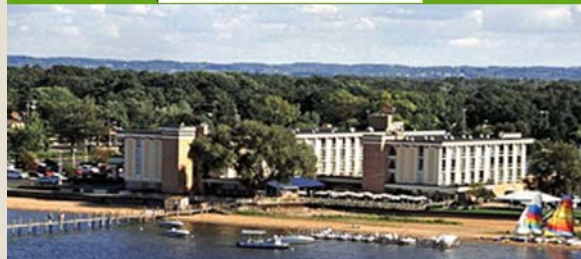
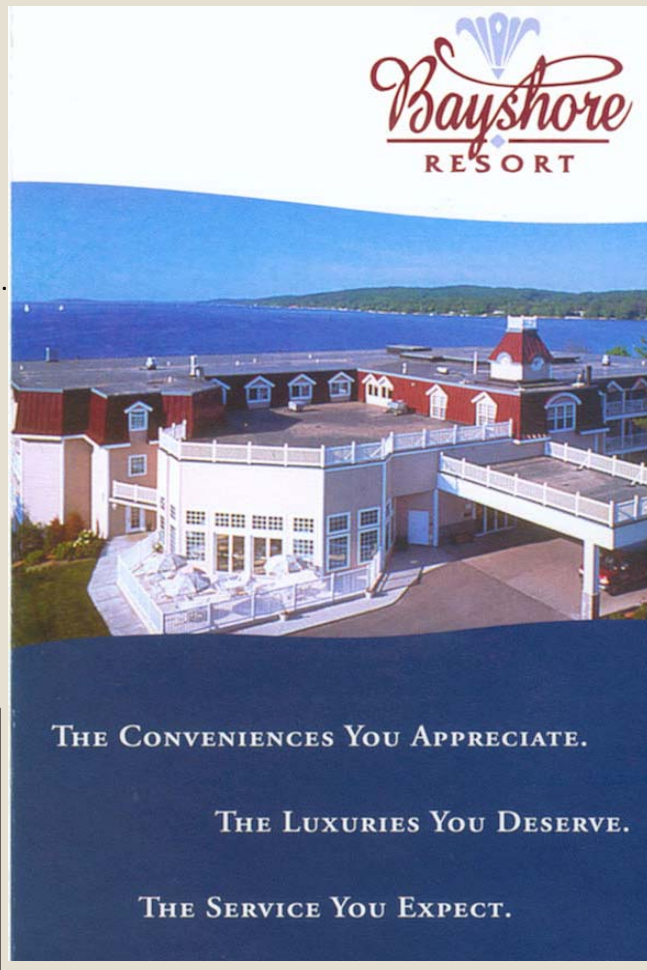
